Bouygues claims net zero construction goal at Welsh project

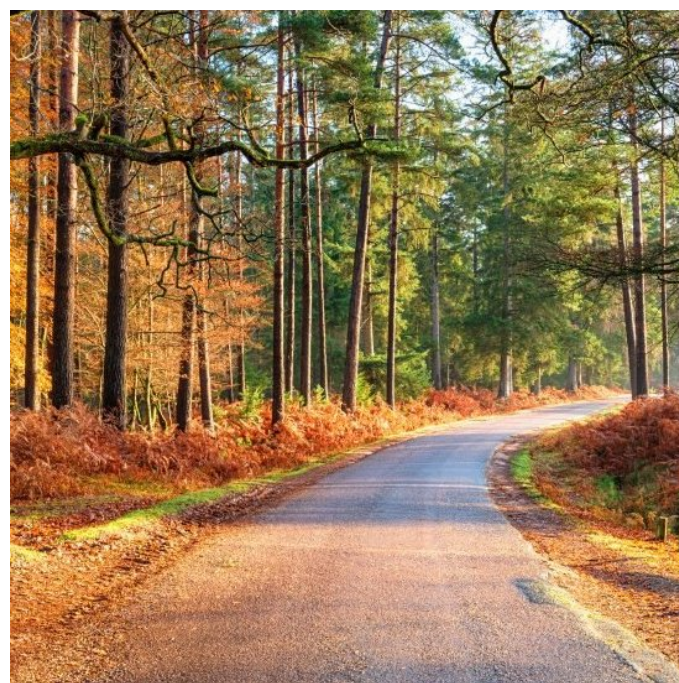
