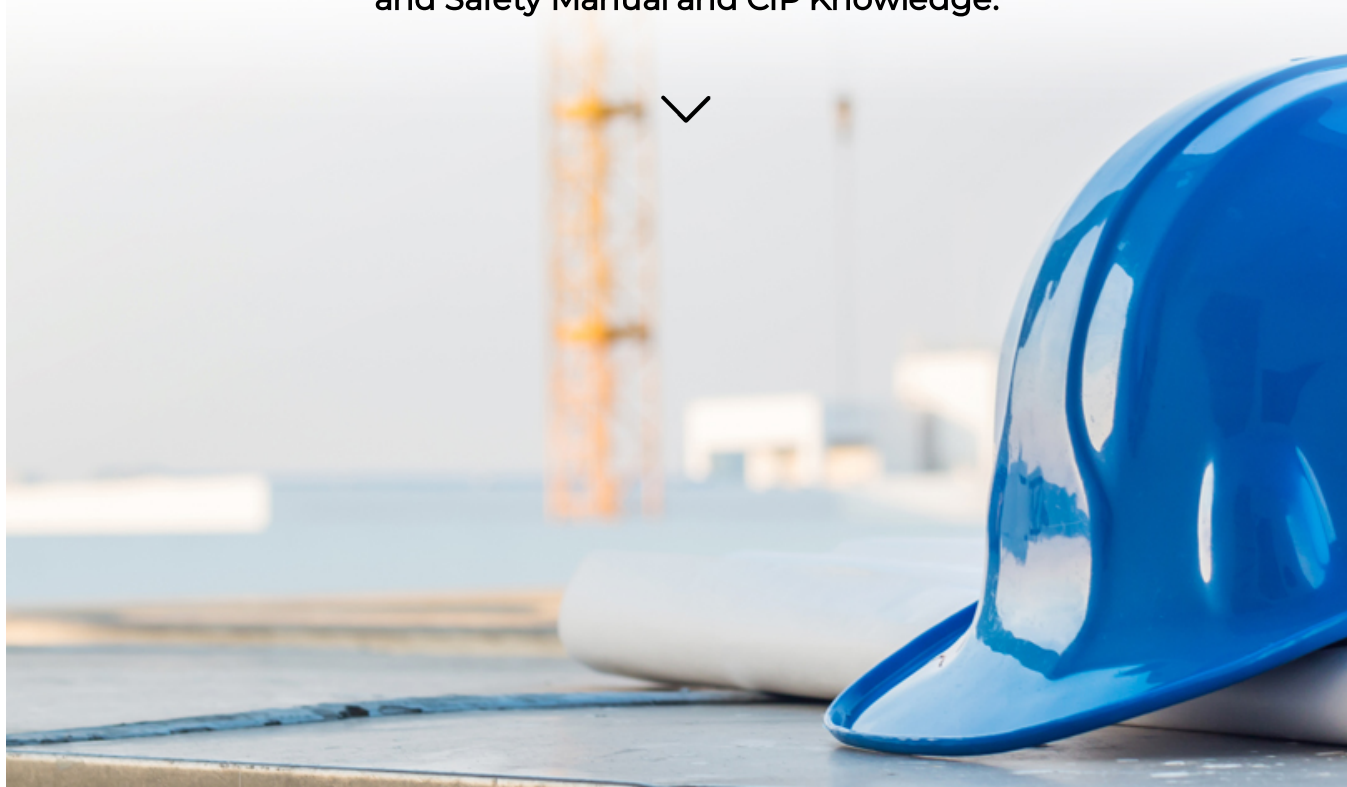

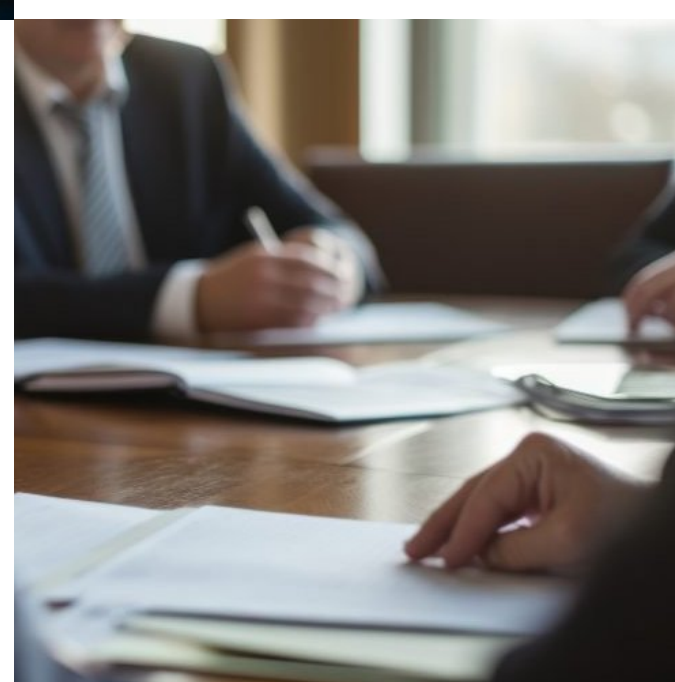

CSCS: Demonstrating Competence

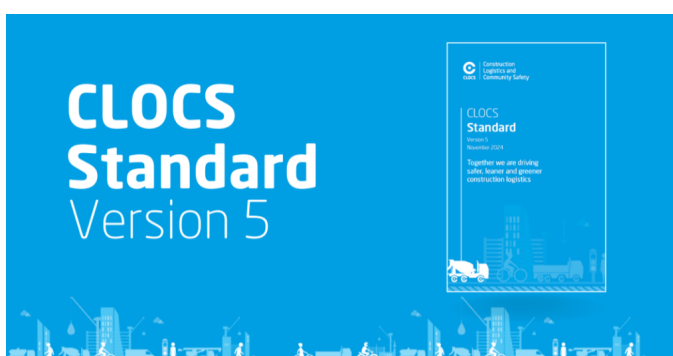
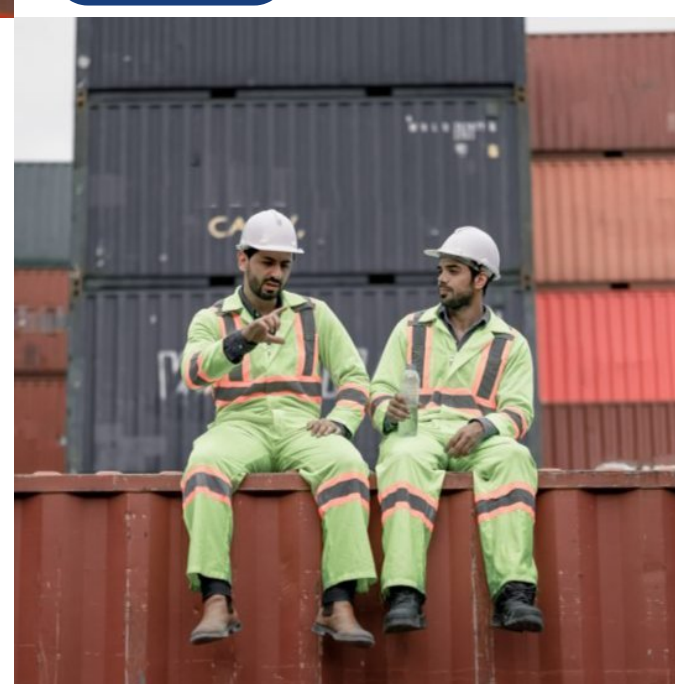
Following the introduction of the Building Safety Act and the increased focus on competence, all CSCS cards obtained via Industry Accreditation will expire on 31 December. With just under 4 weeks to go until the deadline, CSCS has confirmed that there are still over 15,000 individuals who hold an Industry Accreditation card, and companies should have a plan in place to move workers onto the relevant card as soon as possible.
